If you have booked a free course and do not attend without informing us at least 48 hours in advance you will be invoiced for the sum of £35.00. Refusal to pay will result in attendance on further HSI courses being denied.

Contractors, who book a place on the master classes but fail to attend, will be invoiced at the rate of £100 per day i.e. £300 for a 3 day course, £500 for a 5 day course.
