

# Presenting the Project



Who?

- Who should students present their work to? Could external people form a judging panel, or could governors or senior staff take part? Ideally the panel will be people who the students don't know. Alternatively, students could present their work to other classmates.

How?

- Students could make poster displays, powerpoints, or create a Prezi. Alternatively, students could film their presentations. Allow time for students to practice their presentations and receive feedback.

Where?

- Could students present their work out of school, for members of the local community? Would a website be a good tool for final presentation of the project? Could work be displayed in school?

Skills

- Presenting the project fosters confidence and teamwork, and allows students to develop their communication skills.

Presenting the entire project to a small panel or a classroom audience provides a focus for the entire project, an opportunity to celebrate hard work and reflect on learning.
